











TICKET INFO:

Single adult pass (good for one day only): \$28 Two-day pass (good any two days): \$45 Four-day pass: \$80 Kids 5-12 (with adult): \$5/day Senior (65+): \$8/day Guests with disabilities: \$5/day Kids under 5 are free

* These tickets are available at the Bumbershoot ticket gates during the festival. Accessible parking is located on the first level of the Mercer Street garage, and in the Fifth Avenue lot, First Avenue garage, and various private lots around

Seattle Center. Courtesy wheelchairs are located at Gate 6 (Mercer Street), Gate 1 (Monorail station), and Bumbershoot Reception (third floor of the Center House). ADA brochures are available at bumbershoot.org.

All other tickets are available at bumbershoot.org, participating Starbucks, through Ticketmaster, or at Bumbershoot gates September 2-5. Limited Gold and Platinum passes are also available at bumbershoot.org.

Access to all Bumbershoot events is on a first-come, first

served basis. The final Mainstage shows each evening require a free wristband-which you can pick up at information booths on the day of the show-for entrance. Wristbands are issued one-per-customer on a first-come, first-served basis. See map for locations.

GENERAL INFO:

Bumbershoot will happen regardless of weather, and all listings are subject to change.

Bumbershoot tickets afford concertgoers free admission to the Children's Museum on Friday, September 2; 25% off the price of EMP admission; and 50% off admission to the Space Needle's Observation Deck during the festival. Some restrictions apply. See the Space Needle ticket office for details. Entrance to the Pacific Science Center and Fun Forest are not included in Bumbershoot admission.

TRANSPORTATION: **Downtown Metro**

Shuttles Every seven minutes, specially marked "Bumbershoot" shuttles will run between Third Avenue

and Pike Street downtown, and

Fifth Avenue North and Broad Street at Seattle Center. Regular fares apply to rides to Seattle Center, but the return trip is free.

Downtown Metro Buses

Northbound bus stops specially marked "Bumbershoot Service" on First, Third, or Fifth Avenues will take you to Seattle Center from downtown. You can also catch routes 1 through 4 (Third Avenue), 15 and 18 (First Avenue), and 16 (Fifth Avenue)

Other Metro Buses There are 13 buses that run

to Seattle Center. Direct service comes from routes 1-4, 8, 13, 15, 16, 18, 19, 24, 33, and 74. More info at transit.metrokc.gov.

Metro Northgate Park & Ride

Saturday through Monday, Metro shuttles will run between Northgate Park & Ride (NE 112th Street and Fifth Avenue Northeast) and Seattle Center (Mercer Street at Third Avenue North, in front of the Intiman Playhouse).
