BACKGROUND


This memo highlights the results of a recent statewide survey conducted for Tobacco Free Kids by EMC Research. A total of 500 interviews were conducted with likely November 2012 voters in Washington State.

The margin of error for the overall results is ±4.4 percentage points at a 95% confidence interval.

KEY FINDINGS

There is near universal support for the state's 2005 law banning smoking in public places.


- 84% of likely voters support the law, and three-fourths (76%) strongly supporting the law. Only (16%) ٠ likely voters oppose the law.
- Three-quarters or more of voters in every major demographic subgroup support the law. •
- Even among smokers, a strong majority (67% Support / 32% Oppose) support the ban. ٠



Prohibit smoking in public places

Voters overwhelmingly oppose changing Washington's clean indoor air law to allow cigar smoking in dedicated areas of some stores, restaurants, and bars.

- By a 44 point margin (71% Oppose / 27% Support), likely voters oppose changing the clean indoor air law and a majority (56%) strongly oppose the change. Only a quarter (27%) support the change, with 13% strong support.
- A majority in every major demographic subgroup oppose the change.
- Smokers are divided (51% Support / 49% Oppose) about the change.
