

My name is Rick Walther, I am owner of Petition Management Services.

Around March 5th, 2012 I received a call from Eddy Agazarm about the upcoming I-1185 campaign, and we discussed the contract details for payment on I-1185.

I recruited workers through the month of March for the upcoming I-1185 petition drive.

On April 4th 2012, we had a meeting at the Hawks Prairie restaurant in Lacey. At the meeting Eddy handed me my contract agreement, plus blank I-1185 petition sheets.

My contract was signed by Roy Ruffino. The contract stated that I would be paid \$1.40 per signature on I-1185, in which \$1.00 went to the workers and 40¢ was my pay for managing.

My first turn-in on April 11th, 2012 exceeded my expectations, and I turned in 3,158 signatures on I-1185, which was the highest turn in for the week out of all the other contractors.

The second turn-in on April 18th, 2012, I was again the top producer, turning in 4,330 signatures on I-1185. At that same turn-in, on 4-18-12, we were told by Eddy, to take the blank I-517 volunteer petition sheets and we were expected to turn in equal numbers on I-1185 and I-517. If our petitioners did not want to work the I-517 volunteer issue, Eddy said they could "Go home, at anytime" meaning go for
