### 15 INITIAL INCIDENT DESCRIPTION / NARRATIVE:

{On the above date at 1558 hours, officer Phil Rees and I were dispatched to an animal bite in front of 632 48th Ave SW, Seattle, Washington. Upon arrival Seattle Fire Engine 37 was on scene attending to victim [REDACTED]. According to Ms. [REDACTED], she was jogging northbound on 48th Ave SW when she stopped in front of 632 48th Ave SW for a moment to remove a shirt. Suddenly, and without warning two dogs, one large and the other small left the yard of 632 48th Ave SW and attacked her.

Ms. [REDACTED] describes the incident as terrifying. She stated the larger dog bit her so hard that his K9 teeth punctured her skin. She believes that both dogs bit her but she is not sure. However, she believes that she was bitten twice. The attack was stopped after the dog's owner heard her screaming in fear. Ms. [REDACTED] secured both dogs and put them inside the house.



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In speaking with Ms. [REDACTED], she explained that her dogs were off leash in her front yard before the attack. She stated the attack was an accident and because the victim was afraid and screaming contributed to the dog's behavior. Ms. [REDACTED] stated the larger dog is five years old and his name is "[REDACTED]." He is a "Golden Retriever mixed" and he is registered with the City of Seattle. The smaller dog name is "[REDACTED]" and he is a mixed Terrier. Ms. [REDACTED] was advised that because the dogs had bitten a citizen that both dogs would be seized by Animal Control for a short period of time.

She was given a business card and a case number by ofc. Phil Rees.

I took photos of the bite marks and uploaded the pictures into Seattle Police Photo Management System. (DEMS).

Ms. [REDACTED] could not provide proof that both dogs were registered with the City of Seattle.

The City of Seattle, Animal Control arrived and I spoke with officer Bobbi Soper. She checked Ms. [REDACTED] and her partner [REDACTED] name through their DATA base and found no record that both dogs were registered.

Officer Soper advised Ms. [REDACTED] that both dogs are home Quarantine for a period of 10 days. She was also advised that she would be cited for off-leash violation and bite to human.

On 03-16-2014 I was working uniformed patrol as 3D1 in a marked patrol vehicle. At approximately 2049 hours I was dispatched to a vehicle vs. pedestrian collision at the 1900 block of Boren Ave.

According to the driver of vehicle #1 (Woods, William), he was driving Northbound on Boren Ave when his vehicle collided with an unknown object. At the time of the collision, Woods thought his mirror hit another vehicle so he turned around and then realized that he had collided with a pedestrian who was crossing the street going eastbound. Woods stated that he was driving approximately 30-35 MPH when his driver side mirror struck the victim in the head. The driver side mirror of vehicle#1 was broken and dangling from the vehicle. There were also several lug nut covers that were broken off of the front driver side wheel of the vehicle. Woods was identified via his Washington State driver's license. NOTE: Woods is a driver for American Medical Response Ambulance service and was driving an AMR ambulance at the time of this collision. Woods presented current proof of insurance through ACE American Insurance Company (#SAB0098636).

There were three witnesses to this collision who were stopped in the northbound lanes of Boren Ave so that they could let the pedestrian cross the street. All three witnesses stated that once the driver (~~Shirwan Aramian~~) stopped his vehicle the victim (~~Shirwan Aramian~~) waved at them and then entered the roadway. ~~He~~ then waved at vehicle #1 as if he thought the ambulance was going to stop so he proceeded to cross the street. Witness stated that after the collision, ~~he~~ spun around a couple of times and then landed on the ground directly in front of their vehicle.

At the time of this collision, the pedestrian was wearing all dark clothing. ~~Man~~ was wearing a light brown shirt underneath a dark blue jacket. On top of the dark blue jacket, ~~Man~~ was wearing a black jacket. ~~Man~~ was wearing black pants and dark brown shoes and was carrying a dark colored backpack.


SFD Medic 10 arrived on scene and transported Martin to Harborview Medical Center with major head trauma. At the time of this report, ~~Negron~~'s injury status is unknown. SPD Traffic Collision Investigation Squad responded and processed the scene.

Sgt. Edwards #5969 responded to the scene.
