Dear Anthony,

As required by Seattle City Hall Building Rules, this is a permit to use only the lower plaza of City Hall on Saturday, 6/10/17, for an Act for America rally. Setup begins at 8am. The event starts at 10am and will end at 2pm. You expect approximately 350 people to attend.

Use of City Hall property for this event is outlined below:

- **No access is granted to any interior portion of City Hall to participants or attendees.**
- Amplification will be used – the City of Seattle will provide the electricity to power your PA system. In addition a bullhorn may be used. Amplification must be in compliance with Seattle Municipal Code (SMC) 25.08.520 Noise in Public Parks and Places
- Plaza fountains will be off
- Media may be present
- Signs and banners will be used in compliance with SMC 23.55.012 on temporary signage, and City Hall Building Rules (referenced below). Signs may not be attached to the building, railings, or any part of City property.

5.2.2 (4) Signs and banners. An individual may carry one sign or banner no larger than 36" by 36". No unattended signs are allowed, except for one free-standing sign during an event not to exceed 36" x 36". Signs and banners must be carried in a manner that does not jeopardize the safety of others

- You are providing your own security. To reiterate our discussion yesterday, they do not have authority on City property, and will be used only to interact with your attendees in a peaceful manner. In addition, you indicated your security would be carrying weapons. City Buildings and Premises: Access, Operating Hours, & Rules of Conduct," FFD Rule #06-03, [5.2.4] prohibit weapons, "except as specifically permitted by law." In this case, Washington State Law does allow "open-carry" of weapons, and it will be allowed under the following conditions:

It is unlawful for any person to carry, exhibit, display, or draw any firearm, dagger, sword, knife or other cutting or stabbing instrument, club, or any other weapon apparently capable of producing bodily harm, in a manner, under circumstances, and at a time and place that either manifests an intent to intimidate another or that warrants alarm for the safety of other persons." RCW 9.41.270(1); SMC 12A.14.075(A). SPD has the duty and authority to protect the public and to enforce the laws of the City of Seattle and the State of Washington. Any "guests," of the applicant, "security," or other participants in the event have no such authority. If such "guests," "security" or participants commit any violations of law, including the above statute and ordinance, they will be subject to arrest and prosecution.

Use of City Hall must comply with all City, County, State, and Federal laws, and be consistent with the rule regarding "City Hall, City Hall Plaza & Other Adjacent Premises," FFD Rule #05-02, and "City

Buildings and Premises: Access, Operating Hours, & Rules of Conduct," FFD Rule #06-03, unless otherwise stated in this permit. In addition, you shall comply with all laws and rules regarding political activities on public property, including RCW 41.06.250. Compliance with fire code capacity requirements is also expected. The Fire Marshal has been notified of your event and the possibility of an overcapacity situation. The Fire Marshal has the authority to shut down an event if deemed unsafe to the public.


