

NOTICE OF EMERGENCY WORK

March 5, 2015

Emergency Water Main leak Investigation on S Main Street between 1st Avenue S and 3rd Avenue S

PROJECT / DESCRIPTION

Seattle Public Utilities (SPU) is investigating a potential water main leak on S. Main Street between 1st Avenue S and 3rd Avenue S. A water infrastructure repair may be required.

In order to perform this work, some customers may have their water temporarily shut off for up to 6-8 hours. SPU Customer Service staff will notify affected customers with a separate door-hanger notice in advance of the water shutdown. **No emergency shutdown is being planned at this time. If one is required in the near future, we will provide notification in advance of the shutdown.**

SCHEDULE

SPU began working the morning of Thursday, March 5. Crews will work from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. Some evening and/or night work may be required.

LOCATION

Work will occur along S Main Street between 1st Avenue S and 3rd Avenue S.

PROJECT IMPACTS

- **Water shutdown (if required):** Some customers will be without water service for up to 6-8 hours. SPU Customer Service staff will notify affected customers with a separate door-hanger notice with details. **No emergency shutdown is being planned at this time.**
- **Lane closures and detours:** Possible lane closures along S Main Street during work hours.
- **Restricted parking:** Some street parking around the work zone may be restricted.
- **Construction impacts:** Noise, dust, vibration and increased construction traffic.
- **Temporary discolored water:** When the water is turned back on, some customers may need to run their faucets for a few minutes to remove any discoloration in the water.
